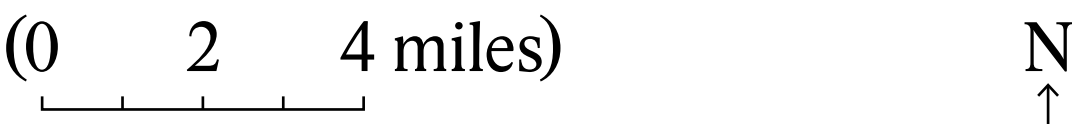

REPURPOSE/Lighting Intervention

Since 1980, Vicki DaSilva has been making single-frame time exposure photographs at night. Vicki is credited with the term “light graffiti,” as well as being the first artist to make deliberate text light graffiti photographs. Influenced by Joan Jonas and Richard Serra (with whom she worked for ten years), DaSilva and her husband Antonio use fluorescent bulbs attached to a complex system of tracks and pulleys to create her work.
